OTR Pre-Registration

Last year, the OTR Pre-Registration process underwent a complete overhaul. The OTR Pre-Registration Committee has listened to your suggestions and implemented new processes to make pre-registering for OTR a very easy process. Once pre-registration for OTR goes on-line, you will be able to pre-register for OTR and purchase some really cool OTR merchandise. You will also be able to pre-register for an event or two that sold out last year before

OTR started.

This year there will be an increase of \$3 per adult attendee in order to provide a consistent revenue stream for the awarding of grants. The grants awarded by TRA support the ongoing research and education related to caves and caving within the community of cavers associated with TRA.

Mark your calendars for July 1st. This is the day that Pre-Registration for OTR 2019 is scheduled to be open. Make sure that you jump on-line early to pre-register. There will be some awesome OTR 2019 merchandise that will be available in limited quantities. Once these items are sold out, they may not be available for purchase during OTR.

OTR Day Passes

The OTR Day Pass fee for OTR 2019 will decrease from \$20 per day to \$10 per day. The decrease in the fee for day passes has been established in order to allow those cavers within the immediate geographic region more economical access to OTR in order to visit with friends and fellow cavers. Day Pass attendees will also be able to visit the many vendors on Vendor's Row at OTR. Day Pass attendees will be required to either exit the TRA property by 6:00 or they can convert their Day Pass admission into a full admission to OTR by visiting the Registration Pavilion and completing the proper registration documentation.

Military Tribute

Please don't delay on getting this information submitted, as I want to make sure that all deserving members of our military family are included in the military tribute at OTR.
